Health Department offers Radon test kits for Radon Action Month

During National Radon Action Month in January, the Washington Ozaukee Public Health Department is encouraging citizens to test their homes for radon by offering free test kits to residents. We are asking residents to bring a non-perishable food item that has **not expired** to our department and outreach events in exchange for a free short term test kit. One Discounted test kit per household. Without the donation of a non-perishable item a short term test kit costs \$7.00 and long term test kit cost \$20.00. All items collected during outreach events will be donated to a local food bank. Please note that postage on the test kit is not included.

Radon is a naturally occurring odorless, colorless gas found in rock and soil. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer, claiming the lives of an estimated 20,000 Americans each year. In Wisconsin about 1 out of 10 homes contain high radon levels.

The radon test kit is easy to use and only takes a few minutes to set up. Once you open it, the kit stays in your home for two days. Then you will package it and mail it to the lab for analysis. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Surgeon General strongly recommend all homes be tested for radon. Homes with radon levels of **four picocuries per Liter (4 pCi/L) or higher should be remediated**. If you choose to have a mitigation system installed, it is recommended that the system be installed by a certified mitigation professional.

Certified Environmental Health staff will be handing out the kits and answering questions at the following time and locations:
