KNOWING YOUR RIGHTS

Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) Providing Urgent Maternal Protections for Nursing Mothers Act (PUMP ACT)-

Employers are required to provide "reasonable break time and a place, other than a bathroom, that is shielded from view to express breast milk while at work. This right is available for up to one year after the child's birth."

Wisconsin State Statute 253.165 -

"A mother can breastfeed her child in any public or private location where the mother and child are otherwise authorized to be. In such a location, no person may prohibit a mother from breastfeeding her child, direct a mother to cover her child or breast while breastfeeding, or to otherwise restrict a mother from breastfeeding".

MEDICATIONS & BREASTFEEDING

When you are breastfeeding please remember to contact your doctor before taking any medication (prescription, over the counter, vitamins/supplements).

BREAST PUMPS

1. Contact your insurance provider
2. Ask how to order your personal electronic pump
3. You may need to order the pump through a Durable Medical Equipment Provider (DME) and it may require a prescription or Prior Authorization from your Provider.
4. Check with a lactation consultant to ensure you chose a good quality breast pump and are using appropriately sized flanges.

As of 2022, ForwardHealth (BadgerCare Plus and Medicaid) covers the purchase of a maximum of three breast pumps per member per lifetime. Most Private Health Insurances cover breast pumps.
